## Time Commitment

An average Board Director will spend approximately **872 hours a year** dedicated to Canyon Lake POA business. That averages out to over **3 hours a day** and, according to our Directors, "It can sometimes feel like a part-time job."

We are an especially large property owners association and extremely active with several projects under construction, ongoing maintenance, and nearly 200 employees hard at work every day.
